We reaffirmed our commitment to our mission by establishing the Center for Racial and Gender Equity and extensive community learning opportunities. Measurable Outcomes

- Sexual Assault Prevention and Counseling Center hotline, counseling, and medical and legal advocacy to victim survivors of sexual abuse and their significant others along with prevention programs to the community to change attitudes, believes and behaviors.
- 30th year as the Designated Rape Crisis Hotline for Lancaster County
- 224 calls answered on the 24/7 rape crisis hotline by trained staff and volunteers
- 580 persons- received counseling and advocacy services when we pivoted to telehealth options
- YWonderful Kids Safe and affordable student programming for economically, linguistically, or socially disadvantaged children.
- 100% -Early Head Start students exhibit progress towards age-appropriate skills in all domains
- 100% -Pre-K students demonstrate Kindergarten readiness skills
- 400 students-attend high quality before and after school care programs
- **Kepler Hall Residence Program** Emergency and affordable housing for low-to-moderate-income single women, children, and men during transitional periods in their lives.
- 100% of emergency residents work with case managers to create a housing plan
- 80% retained long-term or permanent housing for 6+ months and 31% of residents increased their income
- Parent Empowerment Program Education and support for parents in raising their children in emotionally healthy ways in partnership with Lancaster County Children and Youth.
- 65% improvement on expected outcomes from first to final evaluation
- 100% virtual program during COVID-19 to ensure support for families.
- Center for Racial and Gender Equity Building a Lancaster community that promotes equity and inclusion through community engagement, education and advocacy.
- The Racial Equity Institute (REI) offered monthly on a donation basis and all YWCA staff attended
- 18 Lancaster companies/organizations received customized racial equity training
- Dr. MLK Jr. birthday celebration 300+ children attended and received a new book




